German I (for adults)

Teacher: Christine Schoen Wood

Saturdays – 11:30 am to 1:00 pm; June 5 – July 31, 2010 (no class July 3rd)

This class emphasizes vocabulary acquisition, simple conversation, and structure of the German language using traditional methods of instruction. The course covers the first half of Taylor's and Haas' German: A Self Teaching Guide and is designed for beginning students as well as those who already know some German. The self-teaching guide is available from GTHS and costs \$20.00. No prerequisite, although many find Beginning Conversational German helpful.

German II (for adults)

Teacher: Christine Schoen Wood

Saturdays – 9:30 am to 11:00 am; June 5 – July 31, 2010 (no class July 3rd)

This class is a continuation of the German I class and uses the second half of Taylor's and Haas' German: A Self Teaching Guide (available at GTHS for \$20). The class emphasizes structure, vocabulary, and conversation and is designed for those who have completed German I or already know some German. Upon completion of twelve weeks of German II, students should be able to participate in a simple conversation using the present, past, subjunctive and future tenses, as well as grasp adjective endings, comparisons of adjectives, and possessive forms. The class will be conducted primarily in German with a focus on speaking practice and vocabulary building. Prerequisite: German I or equivalent.
